Dear Chairman Inouye and Ranking Member Cochran:

We wish to express our strong support for H.R. 4899 which includes the \$5.1 billion in supplemental funds requested by the President for the Disaster Relief Fund (DRF).

As the Presidents of the National Emergency Management Association (NEMA) and the USA Council of the International Association of Emergency Managers (IAEM-USA) we represent the state emergency managers of all 50 states, territories, District of Columbia, and the Nation's local emergency managers.

It is our understanding that the \$5.1 billion in supplemental funds requested by the Administration for the DRF is intended to close-out all outstanding claims from Hurricane Katrina and the balance of Fiscal Year 2010. While we appreciate the resource strained economic environment, these funds remain critical to effective disaster response and recovery of our communities.

As of February 4, FEMA announced a delay in public assistance funding for declared disasters in order to conserve funds for immediate needs for individuals, debris removal, and emergency protective measures. Now there is great concern funding for even immediate needs will not be available. We urge quick action on this supplemental request to prevent a lapse in disaster relief assistance.
